Transport by Passenger Airline / Personal Luggage

We recommend customers confirm with their Airline before travelling.

- You are typically permitted to carry 4 Li-Ion batteries in your carry on hand luggage that are of 100Wh or less.
- Li-Ion batteries greater than 100Wh and less than 160Wh are restricted to 2 items per person in hand luggage.
 - Li-Ion batteries over 160Wh are restricted on all passenger airlines.
- Li-Ion batteries over 160Wh must be shipped via cargo only under the correct UN number and packing Instructions**
 - Li-Ion batteries are not permitted in the hold unless installed with equipment & is less than 160Wh.
